Specialized Knowledge and Application of Skills	In specific content areas (fields) of political science, develop deeper critical and quantitative thinking skills and apply problem-solving skills to complex problems.
Communication Skills	Communicate effectively in written and oral form about specific political issues. Formulate a well-organized written argument that states assumptions and hypotheses, which are supported by evidence. Present a political argument orally.
