B. A. Sociology – Programme Specific Outcomes

BA Sociology program offers twelve courses in all. Students have to opt **ten** courses viz: four discipline specific courses (**DSC**) two each in BA 1st and 2nd year; four Skill Enhancement Courses (**SEC**) two courses each in 2nd year and 3rd year; and two Discipline Specific Elective (**DSE**) in the third year of the BA programme. Students opting Sociology as DSC-II have to study 6-courses viz; four- DSCs and two- DSEs courses respectively. Sociology department also offers two Generic Elective (**GE**) in 3rd year for students studying other than sociology.
