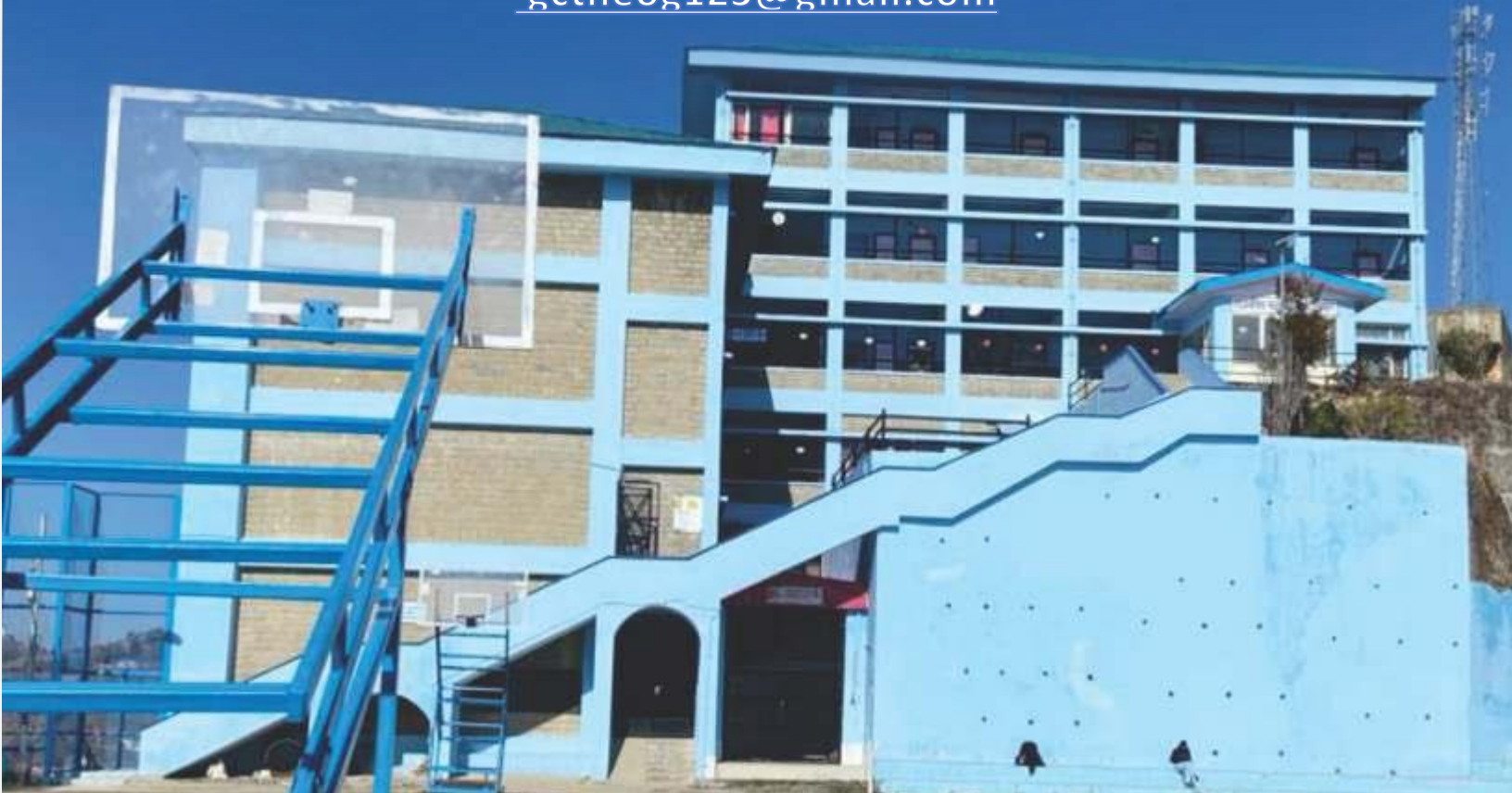

GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE, THEOG

An Overview

The scenic mountain town of Theog is situated at an hour's drive from Shimla, the capital of Himachal Pradesh. The NH-22 meanders and climbs up the hill ranges, covering a distance of 32 kms from Shimla, before it reaches this eye-catching locale. The town has a population of about 9000 and the main occupation of the natives is agriculture/horticulture. The magnificent vista of snow-clad Himalayas provides a majestic background to the town. The crisp mountain air is scented with pine and cedar, which abound in the area. In this poetic setting, at the highest point of the town, atop 'Chundu Hill', is situated the temple of learning, the Government Degree College, Theog.

The college was established in 1998, vide Notification No EDN-A-Chha (15)-13/97 dt 11- 12-97 of the Government of Himachal Pradesh, as a co-educational institution. The first academic session commenced in the year 1999 with admissions to the first year of the three- year degree course. Teaching commenced with a modest strength of about 100 students. The Science and Commerce Faculty were introduced in the session 2002-03. Today, the college has about 900 students on its rolls. The college has been a great boon for the girls living in Theog and its surrounding areas. Earlier parents were reluctant to send their daughters to the far-off colleges at Shimla. Theog College has been a blessing for them and has really improved female literacy in this region. The fledgling college started functioning in the building of a former primary school. The college has been assessed and accredited by NAAC with Grade 'B'. The imposing facade of the present complex and related infrastructure came up in 2006. The college has an adequate number of classrooms, (10, smart classroom with interactive panels) one common room for girls, science laboratories (with interactive board), one language laboratory, one conference hall and two computer laboratories having internet facilities. The campus is Wi-Fi enabled. The college library is very well-stocked and includes a large reading room with computer facility. Library also provides access to ONOS (One Nation One Subscription) and NDLI (National Digital Library of India), and open access platform like DOAJ, DOAB, Google Scholar, internet Archive, enabling students and faculty to explore a vast range of e-books, journals, and learning materials. The library's Web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) allows users to easily search and locate books within the collection. Additionally, the library maintains an informative blog (librarygctheogblogspot.com) to share updates, e-resources, and reading opportunities with students. The college has always worked towards the all-round development of its students and lays special emphasis on sports and extracurricular activities. Some add-on/self- financing/skill courses are also planned as soon as Government approval is received.

Recently, Government College Theog celebrated its Silver Jubilee year. The institution takes pride in shaping the raw and energetic youth into educated and responsible citizens. The steadfast objective of this institution of higher learning is to impart quality education, with the constant efforts of its dedicated faculty.

ADOPTION OF NEP2020

As per notification No. EDUA-009/7/2025-278440-NEP dated 01.04 .2026 Department of Higher Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh has approved the adoption of Semester System with multiple Entry and Exit Scheme at the Undergraduate Level in all Degree Colleges in the State from the academic session 2026-2027.

In NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (UGC-CCFUGP 2022)" incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options, which will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Based on the UGC-CCFUGP notified in December 2022, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla (HPU) has developed a Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (HPU-CCFUGP, hereafter HPU-UGP), incorporating all essential aspects of the UGC CCFUGP to facilitate the achievement of the policy visions stated in the NEP 2020.

Main Features of the HPU CCFUP

- Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines.
- Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi- and/or interdisciplinary learning;
- 3-4 Years UG Programs (but students have to complete the degree in a period of 7 years)
- Use of technology / online courses: 40% credits may be earned through online – MOOCs/ Accredited Online Courses mapped by the HPU
- Internship / Apprenticeship/ Projects / Community Outreach Program
- Academic Research and Dissertation
- Credit weightage for Sports / Yoga / NCC / NSS etc.
- A Degree will be awarded if 60% credits earned from HPU

1. Curriculum And Credit Framework For Undergraduate Programmes (Nep 2020)

The UGC-CCFUGP offers various undergraduate degree programmes for students. The different UG Degree programmes are:

- a. Interdisciplinary Undergraduate Programmes:** The credits for core courses shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects to achieve core competence in the multidisciplinary programme.
- b. Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Programmes:** For students pursuing a multidisciplinary programme of study, the credits for core courses will be distributed across various broad disciplines, including Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, Mathematical and Computer Sciences, Data Analysis, Social Sciences, and Humanities.
- c. UG Degree Programmes with Single Major:** A student must secure a minimum of 50% credits in the major discipline for a 3-year/4-year UG Degree to be awarded a single major.
- d. UG Degree Programmes with Double Major:** A student must secure a minimum of 40% credits in the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major (**Presently not offered by HPU**).

2. Programme Component

As per the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes – NEP 2020 Guidelines; the UG Programme shall either be 3-year UG Programme or 4-year UG Programme. The entire 3-year/4-year UG programme curriculum is divided into two parts:

- a. Core Courses:** The core courses comprise Discipline-Specific, Discipline-Specific Elective (DSE), and Minor courses. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. At the start of the semester each student will opt for three core courses referred to as Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Core/Major/Minor – Subject – A; Subject – B, and Subject – C.
 - i. Major Courses:** Courses offered by a particular department for own students. The minimum credit requirement for a Single Core Discipline (Major) over 3 years is 64, which translates to 16 courses, including 5 DSEs.
 - ii. Minor Courses:** One of the Major courses offered by the Department shall be treated as a Minor for students of other departments. The department may also offer a separate course or repeat the same course(s) as a Minor for students of other departments. The minimum credit requirement for a Minor Course over 3 years is 24, which translates to 6 courses.
- b. Common Course:** These include different types of courses must be studied by all students in the 3-year or 4-year undergraduate programme. Together, the common courses have a credit allocation of 36, divided over five subdivisions.
 - i. Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC):** The Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) are intended to give students exposure to fields outside of your chosen core subjects. Therefore, MDC must be from a different faculty or discipline than Major and Minor subjects. Total Credits requirement is 9 for these Courses.
 - ii. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** AEC is designed to develop communication skills and linguistic competence outside of your primary subjects. The AEC must be in a different language from what you are studying in your Core or Minor subjects. These includes the courses on Language viz. English, Hindi, and Sanskrit. Students have to earn 8 Credits in these courses.
 - iii. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)** are designed to bridge the gap between academic knowledge and practical employability. In the 1st and 2nd semesters, the SECs must be chosen from the subjects that have been selected as Core or Minor disciplines. In the 3rd semester, the SEC can be chosen from a pool of courses offered by the college. Students will have to earn 9 Credits in these courses.
 - iv. I/A/P/C/ (or Work-based Vocational Course*):** Total credits 4 Internship/Apprenticeship/Minor Project/Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) or Work based Vocational Courses are courses common to all students and will be carried out during the winter and summer terms/vacations. Although offered in the second semester, students may be encouraged to make their choice at the end of the first semester, allowing them to carry out activities during winter vacation as well. Students have to earn 4 credits.
 - v. Value-Addition Course (VAC):** These are the course(s) common to all students are designed to provide holistic, value-based education that goes beyond your academic subjects. They focus on ethical, environmental, and constitutional values. Students have to earn 6 Credits in these courses.

3. Multiple Entry and Exit Options

Students can exit the programme at various points with specific certifications, provided you meet the credit requirements:

- **UG Certificate:** Awarded after 1 year (2 semesters) with 44 credits.
- **UG Diploma:** Awarded after 2 years (4 semesters) with 86 credits.
- **Bachelor's Degree:** Awarded after 3 years (6 semesters) with 128 credits.
- **Honours Degree:** Awarded after 4 years (8 semesters) with 168 credits

4. Structure of 3-year/4-year UG Programme

Semester I: During the first semester of UG Degree Programme, the student will study four types of courses:

- i. **Core Courses (4 credit each):** In the first semester, students will select **three** different subjects within the same stream (i.e. Arts, Science or Commerce). He/she will choose three core courses of 4 credit each. Subject A (DSC-A1) and Subject B (DSC-B1) as Core course and Subject C (MC1) as Minor course. Maximum 2 language courses can be opted a Core and Minor.
- ii. **Multidisciplinary Course (3 Credit): One** Multidisciplinary course (MDC1) will be selected from a “Pool” of courses. It will be course other than Core (Major and Minor subjects). Ideally, MDC shall be from the discipline other than the one studied by the student.
- iii. **Skill Enhancement Courses (3 Credit):** During First Semester, a student has to study one SEC course. The SEC1 during the First and Second Semester must be chosen from the DSCs / Minor Courses.
- iv. **Ability Enhancement Course (2 Credit):** One AEC course will be selected from language courses offered by the college. AEC shall be a language other than DSCs/Minor.

Note: Therefore, during the first semester, a student will study 2 DSCs, One MC, One SEC, One MDC, and One AEC. Total credits earned by a student at the end of the first semester will be 20 credits.

Semester II: During the second semester of the UG Degree Programme, the student will study following courses:

- i. **Core Courses (4 credit each):** In the second semester, students will study three core courses i.e. Subject A (DSC – A2), Subject B (DSC – B2), and Subject C (MC2).
- ii. **Multidisciplinary Course (3 Credit): One** Multidisciplinary course (MDC2) will be selected from a “Pool” of courses. It will be course other than Major and Minor subjects.
- iii. **Skill Enhancement Courses (3 Credit):** During second semester, a student has to study **one** SEC course. The SEC2 during the First and Second Semester must be chosen from the DSCs / Minor Courses.
- iv. **Value-Added Course (VAC) (2 Credit):** Under the new HPU curriculum (NEP 2020), **Environmental Science (EVS)** is classified as a Value-Added Course (VAC).
- v. **Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) (4 credits)** Internship/Apprenticeship/Minor Project/Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) or Work based Vocational Courses are courses common to all students and will be carried out during the winter and summer terms/vacations.

3-Year B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. with Major in a specific discipline.

4-Year B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Honours/Honours with Research) with Major/ and Minor/ in a specific discipline.

- In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects of the same stream: A, B, and C.

- At the end of the second semester, each student may choose any one of two programs: **Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Programme** or **Single Major Programme**. The students choosing the Single Major Programme will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of second semester. Such choices made at the end of the second semester shall continue until the sixth semester.
- Another discipline's DSC of the first two semesters of those students who opt for a Major Programme will be treated as Minors.
- A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. The students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects but will have to earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
- MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than the core courses.
- AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 and SEC-2) must be chosen from discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
- A maximum of two language courses can be opted as Core and Minor. AECs should be of a language other than those studied in DSCs/Minors.
- I/A/P/C activities will be determined at the end of the first semester, enabling students to carry out these activities during winter vacation.
- To pursue a 4-year Honours degree, a student must study one discipline in which s/he has studied at least 11 Core courses (6 DSC + 5 DSE) in the first three years.
- A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till Semester 6 (up to 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree (Honours with Research), provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
- Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfillment of the following conditions:

(a) Major: 64/84 credits (3/4 years) in one subject/discipline

(b) Minor: 28 credits (4 years) in one subject/discipline

Note: *As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications*

5. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

The HPU-UGP is directly connected to the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in HPU-UGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university. As such, a student under HPU-UGP must register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

Key Terms used:

- **Credit:** A credit is a unit used to measure coursework. One credit determines the number of hours of instruction required per week during a semester. **Example:** A 3-credit lecture course consists of three 1-hour lectures every week.
- **Grade Point Metrics**
- **SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average):** This is the average of the grade points you earn in a single semester.
- **CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average):** This is the overall average of your grade points across all semesters completed so far.

Major vs. Minor Stream

- **Major:** This is your primary focus area where you pursue in-depth study. You must earn at least **50% of your total credits** in your major discipline. For a 3-year degree, this is typically 64 credits.
- **Minor:** These courses provide a broader understanding beyond your major. A single core course from another department can be treated as your minor. You need a minimum of 24 credits for a minor over three years.

6. Letter Grades and Grade Points

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed from the grades as a measure of the student's performance in a given semester. The SGPA is based on the grades of the current term, while the Cumulative GPA (CGPA) is based on the grades in all courses taken after joining the programme of study. The HEIs may also mention marks obtained in each course and a weighted average of marks based on marks obtained in all the semesters taken together for the benefit of students.

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO FIRST SEMESTER UNDER NEP-2020

- Candidates seeking admission have to fill in the admission form available online on the college website. Students must ensure that he or she has paid the prospectus fee first before filling in the form
- Before applying for admission, students must obtain an APAAR (Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry) ID linked to DigiLocker and also sign an online anti-ragging pledge.
- The candidate must fill in the admission form carefully after reading all the instructions and eligibility conditions.
- The admission form recommended by the admission committee and approved by the principal entitles a candidate to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated time period online by different modes available
- All the relevant information regarding latest notices/notifications, faculty information, links are available on the college website <https://gctheog.edu.in/>
- Change of subject is allowed only with the permission of the Principal within 10 days of the commencement of the session. Change of faculty, i.e., from Science to Arts and vice versa is permissible only if the candidate has the required percentage of marks as specified for admission to that faculty.
- The roster for reservation of seats in various categories shall be as per rules of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.
- All admissions will be as per the admission schedule notified by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla from time to time.
- A candidate who fails to deposit the fee/dues by the scheduled date and time shall forfeit her right to admission and the seat shall be offered to the next student in the merit list for which the notices will be displayed on the notice board and official website, accordingly.
- The college has a functional Pre-Admission Counselling Committee which guides the freshly passed 10+2 students regarding the admission procedure and the choice of subjects as per aptitude and ambition. The committee functions from the college campus itself during office hours.

- *All admissions granted by College are provisional until approved by HP. University.*
- *Admission must strictly follow the university regulations.*
- *The above guidelines may vary depending on the latest notifications issued by HP. University.*

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- i. The eligibility criteria for admission to B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. in the first semester are strictly as per the latest ordinances/guidelines/calendar notified by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla
- ii. A candidate must have passed +2 from a recognized Board/University established by Law in India with English as compulsory subject. The students placed under compartment or failed in +2 examination are not eligible for admission to the college.
- iii. Maximum age limit for admission to BA/BSc/BCom. course is 23 years for general category, 25 years for girl candidates as on the 1st of July of the year concerned. Age relaxation of three years is allowed in the case of SC/ST candidates. The Vice-Chancellor, HPU may, in exceptional cases/circumstances (to be recorded in writing), give relaxation in age up to a maximum of six months to any candidate.
- iv. Relaxation in upper age limit is also available to physically disabled candidates.
- v. Rounding off fraction of marks is permissible.
- vi. Only those students will be considered for Sports quota who have participated in international/ National/ State/District Level Tournaments (or secured positions).
- vii. All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of Vice-Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Summerhill, Shimla.
- viii. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such a candidate

DOCUMENTS/CERTIFICATES REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

- Matriculation certificate for date of birth.
- 10+2 Marks sheet.
- Character certificate in original from the Head of the Institution last attended or a character certificate issued by a Gazetted Officer or the Panchayat Pradhan in the case of private candidates.
- The character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of admission form.
- Candidates who have passed +2 from Boards other than H.P. Board of School Education/ ICSE/ CBSE must submit equivalent eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/University.
- Original Migration certificate from School Boards other than H.P. Board, should also be submitted. Migration Certificate in original is to be enclosed with the H.P. University enrolment form.
- Students of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.-1 are required to upload one copy each of Matriculation & +2 certificate with the enrolment form/registration form.
- Certificate of SC/ST/OBC/IRDP from Magistrate Class I for those seeking relaxation in age/marks/fee concession.
- Any gap (latest) in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence/affidavit as proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. If the gap is 3 years or more, the candidate will not be admitted.
- HP Domicile Certificate for girl students.
- Admission without any of these documents shall be purely provisional and at the candidate's own risk.
- After provisional admission, the candidate shall deposit the hard copy of the admission form along with all the documents / certificates prescribed, failing which, the provisional admission shall be cancelled

ADMISSIONS AND COURSE GUIDELINES- For Yearly System (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com II & III YEAR)

- Admission to the above classes is open on Roll- on basis. In Roll-on system, the students who have studied in I and II year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class i.e. in II and III year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.
- However, these students will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities like filling up of the online admission form and depositing the prescribed fee within the stipulated date and time. Admission schedule as notified by H.P. University will be displayed on the notice board and official website of the college.
- DSC-1 and DSC-II subjects, once chosen/allotted in B.A. I and B.Sc. I year cannot be changed in II or III year of B.A./ B.Sc.
- The students getting admission in II year will have to study two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC-1 & SEC-2) in the DSC-1 or DSC- 2 subjects/disciplines of their choice studied in first year, in addition to the courses DSC-1, DSC-2, Compulsory English/MIL in B.A./B.Com. and DSC-1, DSC-2, DSC-3 in B.Sc. SEC/ AEEC in II and III years will be from DSC-1 or DSC-2 subject allotted in first year.
- The students seeking admission in B.A./B.Com. III year will study the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE-1, DSE2) courses in the subjects/disciplines studied earlier, SEC-3 and SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied and two courses of Generic Elective (GE-1 & GE-2) in an unrelated subject/discipline.
- The students in B.Sc. III year will have to study the DSE-1, DSE-2, DSE-3 courses in the subjects/disciplines selected earlier and SEC-3, SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied.
- Generic subject in B.A. III year will be any subject other than the DSC-1 and DSC-2 (Generic subjects will be allotted by the college).

Note: 1) A candidate who fails to fill the online admission form and deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period under the Roll-on system will not be allowed to attend the classes and appear in the Annual Examination

2) A student declared Fail in the HP University Examination will have to revert back to the previous class in which he/she was declared failed by the university even if he has applied for the re-evaluation.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rules Regarding the Payment of Fee

1. Tuition fee shall be charged for 12 months (June to May) as per schedule.
2. Fees should be paid (without fine) on the dates fixed by the office for each class and notified from time to time. Delay in payment will be fined accordingly.
3. Fee, fine and other dues once paid, will not be refunded.
4. Exemption of tuition fee will be available to Himachali Girls only, subject to the production of Bonafide Himachali Certificate.
5. Disabled students with more than 40% disability will be exempted of tuition fee, subject to the production of Disability Certificate issued by a competent Medical Authority, at the time of admission.
6. After the verification and online counselling of the e-admission form, the selected students being awarded provisional admission shall be sent an online fee link. It shall be the duty of the student concerned to frequently check his/her admission portal account, email account and registered phone number for any alerts. In case the student fails to deposit the fee online within the time period given, the admission offer shall be considered cancelled and given to the student next in line as per merit of the subject

Fines and Penalties

- i) In case a student does not deposit his/her dues on the dates notified, their name will be struck off the roll at the end of the month.
- ii) The name of the student shall also be struck off the rolls of the college if he/she remains absent without prior intimation/approval/permission for 6 days or more continuously.
- iii) If the name of a student is struck off, s/he must be accompanied by their parent or guardian at the time of re-admission.
- iv) Every student will have to procure No-Dues Certificate from College/Library/Concerned Science Department/N.S.S./Sports/ College Canteen/Fee Clerk etc. if they want to leave the college.
- v) The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for a refund of security within one year of his/her leaving the college.

Course Evaluation (Evaluation of the Students)

All courses (Core, Elective, and Skill enhancement) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- (i) **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)** Accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- (ii) **Annual Examination** Accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course for Arts and Commerce. For Sciences and subjects/courses where practical examinations are involved, it will be 50% in Theory, 20% in Practical and 30 % in CCA/CA.

Leave Rules for Students

- (i) A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from the subject teachers and the committee formed for the purpose, but the application should be signed by their parent or guardian.

- (ii) A teacher can sanction leave for up to 5 days while leave for more than 5 days will be sanctioned by the committee constituted for the purpose. Leave application must be submitted in the office.
- (iii) Leave on account of illness, if it is for more than 5 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/Hospital Registration Slip.
- (iv) Students who participate in various inter-college games or other competitions, will have to get their leave sanctioned & noted by the concerned subject teachers before their departure for participation. No exemption/leave will be granted during House Examination.
- (v) Readmission: Students can seek re-admission only twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within 7 days after the name is struck off after paying fee of Rs. 100/- and fee of Rs. 200/- will be charged for the second readmission within 7 days after the name is struck off the rolls.

MIGRATION

1. No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the University. A migrating student will not be admitted to the college if the subjects/course studied by him/her previously are not available or not in combination decided by the college.
2. The migrating student must submit the following documents/information:
 - i) Lecture Attendance Statement (of all subjects offered)
 - ii) Statement of Credit earned by the student under CCA.
 - iii) Character Certificate from the Principal of the college last attended.
3. After migration has been sanctioned and notified by the H.P. University, the student must join the second college within the time stipulated by the University.
4. The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate issued by the university and a certificate of good conduct issued by the head of the institution last attended.
5. A student disqualified by another university shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.

IDENTITY CARD

- 1) Identity Card is the most important document of a college student as it establishes their identity as a college student.
- 2) It is mandatory for every student to carry their college identity card while in the college premises.
- 3) A student without an identity card is deemed an outsider. In the event of inspection of identity card during surprise check or for any other reason, if the student is found without Identity card, he/she will be handed over to the police or as the situation may demand.
- 4) A student is not permitted to replace their photograph on the identity card due to any reason whatsoever.
- 5) It is the personal responsibility of the student to keep their Identity card in safe custody. In case, the identity card is lost or gets misplaced, one must file an FIR to get a duplicate Identity card issued.

LIBRARY AND ITS RULES

The library caters to the needs of the students through its two-fold service, i.e., the Reading Room and the Issuance of books. It has a good collection of books and has different sections for textbooks and reference books.

The library subscribes to as many as 7 daily Newspapers, 15 Magazines and 3 Journals. Students are encouraged to avail the library facility during college hours on all working days.

RULES

- 1) Ordinarily, 2 books are issued at a time for 14 days, but the Librarian has the right to re-call the books at any time.
- 2) Reference books are not issued.
- 3) Books are issued on the Library-Cum-Identity Card
- 4) In case of loss of a book, the student will have to replace the book or pay a fine in addition to the present price of

- the book with the permission of the Principal.
- 5) The student is responsible for the book as soon as it is issued. In case a book is defaced/damaged in any way, the book is to be replaced by them.
 - 6) Library-Cum-Identity Card will be issued by the Librarian at the time of admission.

DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

The Principal and the members of the teaching staff have the power to take disciplinary action against students indulging in reprehensible acts, which may lead to imposition of fine, suspension or expulsion from the college. The following acts come within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct.

- i) Ragging in or around the college campus.
- ii) Damage to college property that includes defacement of walls, black boards, and damage to furniture (breaking windowpanes, plucking flowers, removing notices, tempering with electrical/water fittings etc. is also a violation of discipline).
- iii) Loitering around in the campus or corridors during vacant periods causing disturbance to teaching work.
- iv) Putting up notices on the College Notice Board without proper authorization by the college authorities.
- v) Smoking, chewing of tobacco/gutkha, using of cell phones, and plying of vehicles within the college premises is strictly prohibited and any infringement may entail a fine of Rs. 100/-.
- vi) The Director of Higher Education H.P. vide letter no. EDN-HE (21) B (15)/2017-V has directed that the use of Mobile Phones in the classrooms and campus of Educational Institutions will not be allowed. A particular zone will be fixed by the college authority within the campus where students will be able to use their cell phones.

ANTI-RAGGING

All students are hereby cautioned that **ragging is a criminal offence**. "Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, either by words or by conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of the person that he/she cannot pursue his/her studies from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby. Any person who aids or encourages such an action shall also be guilty of ragging."

Ragging in and around the college/hostel campus or on roads/approaches leading there to, is strictly prohibited. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged **under Rule 22.17 (a) (b) (c) of H.P. University** to expel the guilty student(s) from the college/hostel and to report the matter to the police as ragging amounts to criminal offence as per the recent judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble H.P. High Court and the Govt. of H.P.

PUNISHMENTS

The students indulging in ragging will be punished as per law with:

1. Cancellation of admission and withholding/withdrawing scholarship and any other benefit.
2. Debarring from appearing in any test, examination, or any other evaluation process.
3. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international tournament, youth festival etc.
4. Suspension from college and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
5. Fine up to Rs. 50,000/- or imprisonment up to 3 years or both.

All the students admitted to the college shall be deemed to have given the following undertaking:

"I have gone through the rules and regulations regarding ragging and discipline of the university/college, and I hereby solemnly affirm that I will not indulge in any act of ragging/indiscipline and that if am found guilty of such offences as are covered under these rules, I will have no claim against the order of rustication/expulsion from the college."
