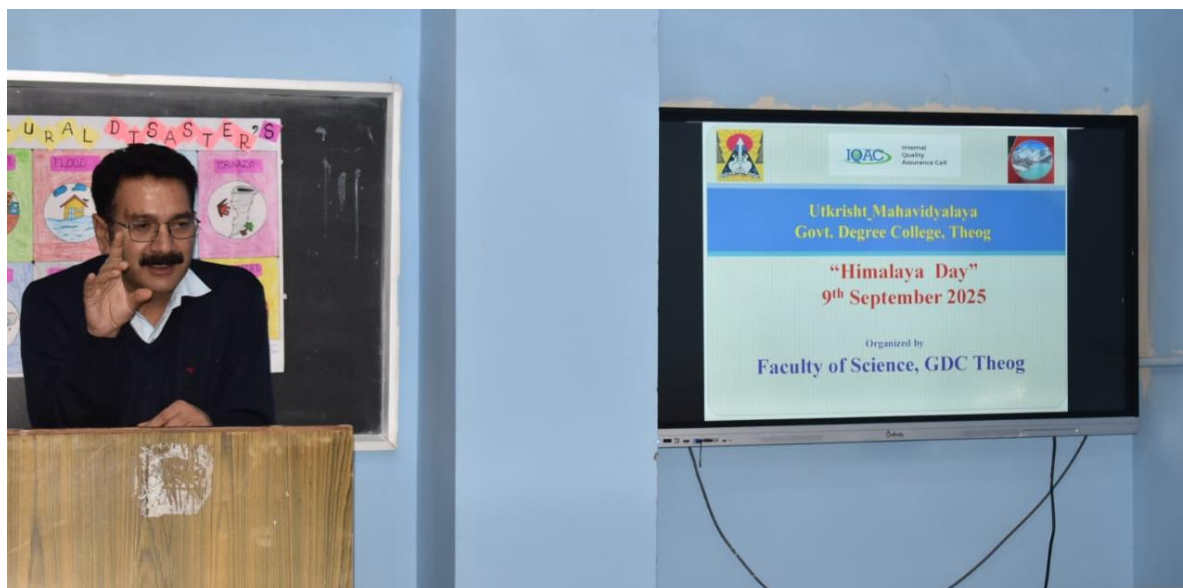


A Report on Himalayan Day Celebration

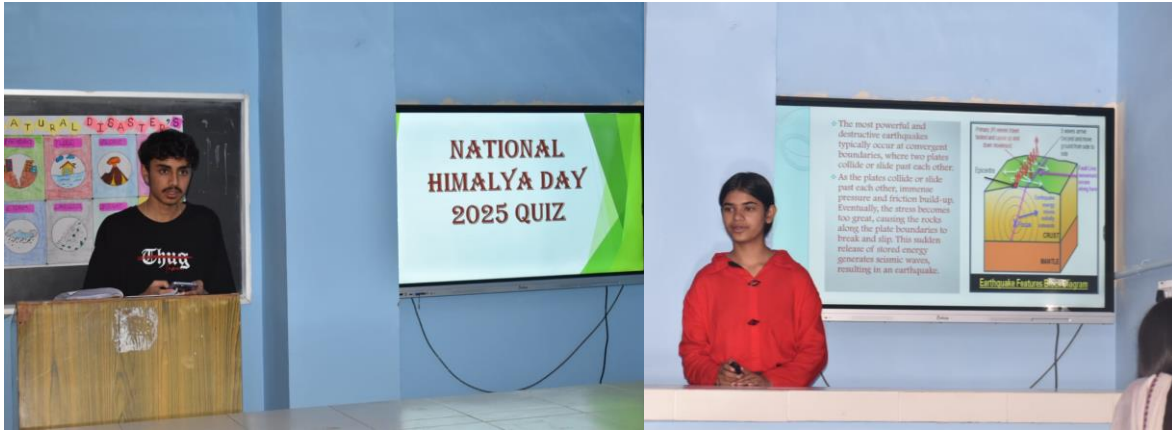
