Summary:

The present study, *“Spatial Analysis of Social Infrastructure in Theog Municipal Council, Himachal Pradesh: A Case Study”*, examines the spatial distribution, accessibility, and adequacy of social infrastructure within Theog Municipal Council in Himachal Pradesh. Social infrastructure—comprising education, healthcare, water supply, sanitation, housing, transportation, and community facilities—plays a vital role in improving living standards and ensuring balanced urban development.

The study adopts a case study approach supported by primary data. Primary data are collected through field surveys, household questionnaires. Spatial tools and simple statistical techniques are used to analyze ward-wise disparities in infrastructure distribution.

The findings indicate that although basic social infrastructure facilities are available within the municipal area, their distribution is uneven across wards. Certain areas experience pressure on water supply, limited healthcare accessibility, inadequate waste management, and traffic congestion due to rapid urban growth. The study highlights the need for planned infrastructure expansion, improved service delivery, and integrated urban management strategies. The research concludes that a spatially informed planning approach is essential to ensure equitable access to social infrastructure and sustainable urban development in Theog Municipal Council.

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
